


Cost of Living resources

Energy Cost

Register as a priority household If you a Priority Household e.g. elderly, with young children, have a disability or serious health condition you can register to ensure that you get swift assistance if there's a problem with energy supply. Warm Home Discount Schemes These are for people on low incomes and in receipt of certain benefits. Each energy supplier opens its scheme at different times so keep checking your supllier's website to see.

Hardship grants

The Action Group can make hardship grants for people supported by HAACS, CAATS and their carers who are in need of essentials. It can also administer grants for Edinburgh Parent Carers who need essentials or need a short break from caring. Food, clothes and crisis

Foodbanks are available across Edinburgh and the Lothians. Many require you to be referred. Help to get clothes is also available for adults and children - again, you need to be referred to many of them. You can apply to the Scottish Welfare Fund for a Crisis Grant. This Crisis guide provides information on some of the help available in Edinburgh.

Remember: If you are struggling to make ends meet and you receive any service from The Action Group or you are a parent carer (Parent caring for a child or adult with a disability), contact our advice team for tailored help and advice on how to maximise your income. Our advisers can also assist by making applications for grants and trusts and refer you to foodbanks and for clothes.
