2. National Care Service Consultation

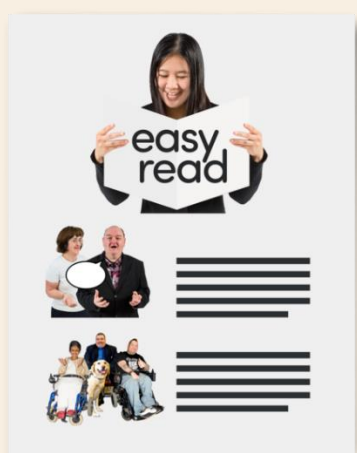
The Scottish Government need to hear what the people of Scotland think before any changes can be made.

3. Where do I find information?

You will find information on the Scottish Government website and on The Action Group Activity Website's National Care Service page.

Taking your time and getting support from someone you trust can really help.



4. Deciding what is important to me!

The consultation is broken down into seven parts.

This makes it easier to look through and think about what parts you want to have your say on.



5. How will I let people know what I think?

You will need to complete and send in a digital or paper consultation form from the Scottish Government website. This can be done

- Online (no easy read version available)
- By email
- By post.

6. Giving my permission

You must use the Respondent Information Form to let the Scottish Government know

- who you are
- and how they can use the information you sent

7. Last Day to have my say!

The consultation will close on Tuesday the 2nd of November so you must complete and send in your consultation form before this date.



8. What did you think of the consultation?

You can have your say on what was good and what could have been better about the consultation.

This can be done by email or by post.



9. What happens next?

The Scottish Government will need time to look at what people had to say.

Once this has happened the results will be shared on the Scottish Government website.
